The Commission has come across many advertisements published in National Dailies offering opportunities for the award of university degrees through various franchise programmes conducted by certain private institutions. These private establishments claiming themselves as study centres or learning centres of different universities enrol students for various degree programmes and also claim to be responsible for teaching and conduct of examinations. The facuity and the infrastructure belong to these private agancies. The concerned university except providing syllabus and teaching materials, has no mechanism to monitor and maintain the academic standards of teaching being imparted at these centres. This blatant compromise with the standards of education has led to widespread criticism. The Commission has taken a serious view of these misleading advertisements appearing in various newspapers.

it is, therefore, clarified for the information of all concerned, including students and parents that:

- a Central or State Government University can conduct courses through its own departments, its constituent colleges and/or through its affiliated Colleges;
- a university established or incorporated by or under a State act shall operate only within the territorial jurisdiction allotted to it under its Act and in no case beyond the territory of the state of its location;
- c) the private universities and deemed universities cannot affiliate any college or institution for conducting courses leading to award of its diplomas, degrees or other qualifications.
 - no University, whether central, state, private or deemed, can offer its programmes through franchising arrangement with private coaching institutions even for the purpose of conducting courses through distance mode.
 - all universities shall award only such degrees as are specified by the UGC and published in the official gazette.
 - the Universities shall conduct their first degree and Master's degree programmes in accordance with the regulations notified by the Commission in this regard.

In this connection, the students and the general public are also hereby informed of the following regulating provisions pertaining to different types of universities:

A private university established under a Stata Act shall be a unitary university. 3. UGC Regulations on Deemed Universities

A Deemed University shall operate only within its Headquarters or from those off campuses/off shore campuses which are approved by the Government of India through notification publishe in the official gazette.

in case of distance education programmes, no institution deemed to be university, so declare by the Govt. of India after 26th May, 2010 [date of publication of UGC (Institutions Deemed to i Universities) Regulations, 2010] is allowed to conduct courses in the distance mode.

The institutions deemed to be universities declared before 26th May, 2010 are not allowed conduct courses in distance mode from any of its off-campus centres/off-shore campus approved after 26th May, 2010.

Approval for new courses and extension of approval of the courses already run by the Deerr to be Universities under distance mode would be granted by the UGC subject to the fulfillm of conditions as laid down by the UGC.

The UGC has not granted approval to any deemed to be university to establish study centre

C. Distance Education programmes of the Central Universities and State C Universities

The Central/State Govt. Universities can conduct courses through distance mode in accorr with the provisions of their respective Act and after the approval of the UGC.

The students are, advised not to take admission in the unapproved Study Centres. Off-C Centres, Franchisee Institutions, Colleges/Institutions claiming to be affiliated with Universities or Deemed Universities.

As you are aware, under Section 22 of the UGC Act, 1956, which is reproduced below, degrees, which may be awarded by the universities, are specified by the Commission:

"The right of conferring or granting degrees shall be exercised only by a University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, A Provincial Act or a State Act or an institution deemed to be a University under section 3 or an institution specially empowered by an Act of Parliament to confer or grant degrees."

(2) Save as provided in sub-section (1), no person or authority shall confer, or grant, or hold himself or itself offices entitled to confer or grant, any degree.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "degree means any such degrees as may, with the previous approval of the Central Government, be specified in this behalf by the Commission by notification in the official Gazette."

This provision is mandatory and binding on all Universities. It has further been directed by the UGC that:

"No University shall confer a degree in violation to the provisions of this notification. It shall be manufatory for the Universities to adhere to the approved nomenclature of degree(s) and ensure the observance of the minimum standards of instruction before award of a degree as hereinafter prescribed."

It is further mentioned that the UGC Regulations being statutory in nature are bir for Universities and Colleges and any violation thereof may warrant appropriate a against the erring institutions. Contravention of the provisions relating to the specificati degrees shall render the defaulting university and its affiliated colleges liable for approaction by the UGC.

The Universities, are once again; requested to abide by the provision of Section the UGC Act, 1956 and award only such degrees as have been specified by the UGC Gazette of India published in July, 2014

If a university wishes to award a degree other than the one specified by the U change the duration of the course specified as minimum in the said notification, approach the UGC for its approval six months prior to starting the degree programn

The University Grants Commission has from time to time been notifying its policy on territorial jurisdiction and offering of programmes through off campuses/centres/study centres by Universities/Institutions. Vide its Public Notice No. F.27-1/2012 (CPP-II), dated 27th June 2013 (copy enclosed), UGC has notified its policy on territorial jurisdiction to be followed by all Universities/Institutions including Open and Distance Learning Institutions, which is as under.

- i) a Central or State Government University can conduct courses on its own departments, its constituent colleges and/or through its affiliated colleges;
- a University established or incorporated by or under a State Act shall operate only within the territorial jurisdiction allotted to it under its Act and in no case beyond the territory of the State of its location;
- the private universities and deemed universities cannot affiliate any college or institution for conducting courses leading to award of its diplomas, degrees or other gualifications;
- iv) no university; whether central, state, private or deemed, can offer its programmes through franchising arrangement with private coaching institutions even for the purpose of conducting courses through distance mode;
- purpose or conducting courses through degrees as are specified by the UGC and
 all universities shall award only such degrees as are specified by the UGC and published in the official Gazette;
 - i) the universities shall conduct their first degrees and Master's degree programmes in accordance with the regulations notified by the UGC in this regard.

The UGC has also issued regulations relating to Private Universities which should be strictly followed by the concerned t regulations is hosted on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in.

The UGC/erstwhile DEC has not given approval to any Uni 5 study centres outside India. Thus, operation of any such centre is . immediately closed. Universities/Institutions are also requested to cl opened in violation of above policy. Also any programme not recogn DEC and wherever necessary by other Apex regulatory bodies, sho distance mode.
